Allied and Scientific Health Enabling Health Reform

The first series of masterclasses will introduce four key streams. The topics for these streams have been selected based on their impact to improve health service delivery, current and future challenges facing allied and scientific health professionals and stakeholder feedback.

An overview of each stream is provided below:

Models of care: this stream will focus on evolving and innovative models of allied and scientific health service delivery, opportunities and challenges and implementing into practice. An international presenter will provide unique insights into how such models can be “operationalised” into traditional health care settings.

Journal club: this stream will put a “new twist” on the age-old journal club. Experienced journal club facilitators will highlight innovative means of delivering journal clubs, promoting engagement with health professionals and contribute to evidence based practice. Participants will be provided with practical examples for implementing these models in their local health care settings.

Publishing: this stream will demystify the art and science of publishing. With increasing calls for publishing to be an important component of health care service delivery, experienced researchers will highlight the step by step process for publishing in peer reviewed journals (scientific writing, selecting a topic, journal selection, peer review process and response to reviewers).

Evaluation: this stream will focus on the nuts and bolts of evaluation. Evaluation is increasingly recognised as a core component of traditional and innovative health care service delivery. Yet, few practical tools are readily available to facilitate rigorous evaluation. Participants will be provided with an overview of theoretical principles and practical tips for undertaking evaluations in their local health care settings.
